Session II - “When do I Breathe? Singing and Moving through Phrases”

Description: How do we help students be musically sensitive to what they hear and sing? This session will use eurhythmics to connect students meter and phrasing, even when the music takes an unexpected turn. Come ready to move, sing, and take home engaging strategies to illuminate meter and phrasing in your own classroom.

Session III – Dalcroze Eurhythmics 101

Description: Designed for those new to the philosophy, this session serves as an introduction to Dalcroze Eurhythmics through the musical concepts of beat, pulse, meter, rhythm patterns, phrasing, character, and expression. Participants will get to experience first-hand how the body is the first instrument on which everything else is built. Since these are foundational Dalcroze subjects, those already familiar with the philosophy can attend this session as an inspiring refresher!

Clinton Pratt has BM and MM degrees in Piano Performance and owns a multi-teacher piano studio in Cincinnati Ohio, where he has been teaching for over 23 years. He is currently a Master Teaching Artist with the American Eurhythmics Society and is the President of the Greater Cincinnati Eurhythmics Society. He has given over 50 presentations at local, state, and national music teacher conferences on various topics including Dalcroze Eurhythmics, piano improvisation, composition, performance anxiety, piano pedagogy, and entrepreneurship. Clinton has served on several boards and committees for various music teacher organizations, and was awarded “Teacher of the Year” by the Ohio Music Teachers Association in 2023.

Session IV – Canon

Description: This session will connect your ear, mind, and body to elevate your musicality. Participants will enhance their active listening skills, sharpen their focus, and build a stronger physical awareness of rhythm and movement. The session begins by establishing a steady beat through walking and clapping. Next, the instructor will play short musical patterns for participants to echo on a delay or continuously follow one measure behind. Finally, participants will be introduced to a short canon, working together as a group to experience it through a *plastique animée*.

Doo-seon Woo is a pianist and Eurhythmics instructor who has collaborated extensively with prestigious institutions, such as Seoul Arts High School and the Boston Ballet. As a music educator, she has delivered Dalcroze Eurhythmics classes, workshops, and lectures across South Korea and the Greater Boston area. She earned her Master of Music Education from Sungshin Women’s University in Seoul, South Korea. Her research, *The Study of Teaching Choir Based on the Dalcroze Approach*, was published by the Korean Association of Arts Education in 2010. She recently relocated to Granville, OH.

Session V – Walk and Run! Playing For Movement Session

Description: Participants are invited to start their journey for playing improvisation for movement. The freedom of improvisation allows the teacher to tailor activities to the specific needs of the students, not to the tempi of recorded music. Everyone will have opportunities to try out basic patterns and formulas for playing for movement in your classrooms including walking, marching, tiptoe, jogging, and more.

Session VI – Piano Improvisation for Dalcroze Eurhythmics Classes

Description: WHO: No prior experience improvising for Dalcroze classes is necessary, although experienced improvisers are most welcome. The session is designed for those with intermediate piano skills who are relatively comfortable playing with two hands, and can navigate scale patterns and primary chords in C Major. Comfort with other keys is welcome but not necessary. WHAT: We will explore and experiment with various ways to play for eurhythmics exercises. Depending on the interests and needs of those in attendance, these may include start/stop, follow the mover, locomotor activities, canon, ball games, major-minor follow, and tempo and dynamics follow.

Kathy Thomsen, DMA, is an enthusiastic Dalcroze practitioner who incorporates the Dalcroze philosophy into her own music-making and teaching. Having earned the Dalcroze License from the Longy School of Music in Cambridge, MA (2003), Dr. Thomsen served as President of the Dalcroze Society of America and editor of the American Dalcroze Journal (2008-2012). Recognizing a need to expand the reach of the Dalcroze philosophy in the American music education community, she joined Dr. David Frego and Dr. Marla Butke in co-founding the American Eurhythmics Society (2014). Now retired from full time teaching at Hamline University in St. Paul, MN (2020), Dr. Thomsen continues to teach summer courses in Dalcroze and general musicianship in the Graduate Programs in Music Education at the University of St. Thomas in Minnesota. She maintains a private piano studio and accompanies classes for BalletMet in Columbus, OH.

Alliance for Active Music-Making AAMM – Syncopation

Description: The purpose of this session is to show how syncopation might be taught via the Kodály approach and the Orff approach. Part A: Kodály Approach - Participants will sing and play Alabama Gal. They will go through the physical, visual, and aural preparation of learning about syncopation. They will go through the process of how to present the written notation for students. Orff Approach - Participants will create an Orffestration for Alabama Gal using speech patterns, body percussion, and melodic ostinati.

Jayne Wenner retired in 2026 as an Assistant Teaching Professor in Music Education at The Ohio State University. Prior to her thirteen years at Ohio State, she taught elementary general music and strings in the Hilliard City School District. She has Kodály certification from KMTI and the Kodály Institute in Hungary, DSA from Carnegie Mellon, and Level 1 Orff at OSU. She conducted three of the Columbus Children's Choirs. Jayne has been a clinician at OAKE, OMEA, MKMEA, TRIKE, and COAOSA, and an international Workshop in Biarritz. She served as the OAKE National Choirs Chair and is the General Music Co-Chair for OMEA PDC.

Session VII – Rhythmic Solfège – It's in the Details!

Description - This session will provide meaningful movement activities which focus on scales, half/whole steps, aural training, and melodic dictation.
